- Involved in digitisation of cultural heritage
- Involved also in Open Data in Czech Republic and Slovakia
- Observation:
 - Big technical overlaps between Culture and Open Data
- Idea: Open Data Node
 - Publication platform
 - Now being implemented in COMSODE project



Yes, Open Data in museums

- Open Data in museums?(*)
 - Is it being done?
 - It should be, it makes sense
 - You might already be doing it
 - And only little adjustments might be needed

(*) and other cultural organizations



Key points

- Investment: small
 - You're most propbably already publishing data to general public (via your portal, Europeana, etc.)
 - With Web 2.0, you may already have an Open Data API (hint: AJAX)
 - If not, it's still easy to do (if the data already is in some database, CMS, etc.)
- Contribution: much bigger than investment
 - Culture sector will benefir for sure: higher use/reuse of data already being published
 - Open Data will benefit too: apps and mash-up developers, ...
 - By extension society will benefit too, not just economically
- Motivation: museum will benefit too
 - Wider use of your data => vider audience for your museum
 - Other museums can use you data too => better collaboration
